They nurture listening and comprehension through read alouds and practice writing by focusing on proper letter formation and punctuation.

Mathematics

Students engage in problem-based instruction and hands-on lessons and activities. They learn to independently recognize, count, and write numerals to 100. They also learn to use mathematical vocabulary, skip count, compose/decompose numbers, classify objects by their attributes, understand the value of a collection of coins, and more. Daily calendar activities reinforce these concepts, while learning centers provide additional practice with skills and problem-solving. This hands-on approach helps develop their understanding and application of mathematical ideas.
